## DISMISSAL PROCEDURE

1. The National Honor Society Advisors shall monitor each member's maintenance of a 3.50 cumulative GPA and maintenance of the criteria used for selection, (service, leadership and character).
2. A student who has not lived up to the standards of selection shall be warned and shall have one quarter to regain the acceptable rating. If at the end of the stipulated time, the student has not regained the acceptable rating, his/her case shall be referred to the faculty council and/or Asst. Principal for evaluation and possible dismissal.
3. If a student commits **violation of school rules** or the standards used for selection that are considered excessive by the administration and/or the faculty council, he/she will be similarly dismissed from the National Honor Society **without prior warning being necessary**.
4. Members are expected to attend all NHS meetings, and to participate in all NHS activities. These activities include Ambassador Table, Induction Ceremony, Candy Cane Sale, Tutoring Program, Blood Drive, and Crusader Court Dinner. If a member fails to participate in these activities (i.e. fails to show up to work the Ambassador table, or fails to attend a meeting) the member will be notified in writing of the violation and the possibility of dismissal.
5. A member who has been dismissed has the right to appeal the decision of the Administration and/or Faculty Council. The appeal should be submitted in writing to the Principal and/or Assistant Principal within a week of receipt of the notice of dismissal. A board composed of the Principal and/or Asst. Principal, a guidance counselor and a teacher not on the Faculty Council, will hear appeals
6. All warnings and notices of dismissal shall be given to members in writing and signed by the Advisors and Assistant Principal in charge of Co-curriculars and/or the Dean of Students.
7. Members who resign or are dismissed are never again eligible for membership or its benefits.
